# What has changed between your first and last MUN experience?

My first MUN conference was JMUN'14. I was a an admin, lacked confidence while speaking in English, and had a hard time socializing. Since then, my confidence, especially regarding English and debating skills has gone up and I have been able to socialize with much more in recent conferences. I learnt a lot about MUN procedures and how and when I should speak. However, the most significant change was being able to embrace people with different opinions as I obtained more experience.

Managing the budget was a difficulty. Even when we had three sponsors we had to consider all our expenditures as well as our incomes. Last minute cancellations were very difficult to handle but as the OT we were able to overcome these challenges in a very small time frame.

## Can you tell us about the differences between other MUN conferences and the BMUN experience?

My first MUN experience was HMUN in the Netherlands. I was a an advisor for our school, ÖBL. The school was a private gymnasium and a 20 minute drive from Amsterdam. Everything went planned with the students, but I did learn a great many things about MUN procedures through THIMUN. Compared to those conferences, we have no approval panel here because in Harvard style we have US-Gs, which means advisors are free to roam and observe the committees as they like.

Our conference website wasn't up and running until June which made it difficult to take applications as other schools were leaving for holiday. It was very challenging to get the applications completed in a very short time. Thankfully, the Organisation Team did a wonderful job advertising the conference on social media and other various platforms.
