Introduction to the Committee by the Secretariat

Committee Description:

It's 1990, and the situation in the East and West Germanies is very complicated. The Berlin Wall fell only a year ago, and the region is very unstable. It seems like there might be a possible reunification. Currently, West Germany is economically much more powerful than East Germany, and the protests occurring in the region are mostly in favor of the West and against East Germany. Therefore, it seems like a possible reunification will lead to an ideologically Western new Germany. But of course, it is hard to foresee the future; the discussions in the committee might lead to unexpected conclusions. The future of Germany/Germanies is all up to the negotiation skills of the Heads of States.

Now, it is up to the Head of States to decide upon what they are going to do: Follow the path of history or draw a path of their own. The performance of the Head of States will shape the flow of the committee and the BHMUN'21 Team will shape their crises in accordance with the flow.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. Head of States' Summit on Germany (HSSG) is a committee that is created by the BHMUN'21 Team. Such a summit did not exist in real life. Nevertheless, the issue (the German Reunification) that the delegates of the HSSG will discuss is all based on real events that have happened back in the 1990s.
2. The delegates of HSSG will not be given a traditional study guide. Instead, the delegates are expected to watch all the documentaries and videos given below. These sources will be enough for a delegate to be prepared for the committee.
3. Some of the documentaries and videos that are given below mention some events that have happened before 1990 which will be the official start date of the committee. Some videos touch upon the fall of the Berlin Wall which happened in 1989, one year before the HSSG conference date. Nevertheless, due to the historical significance of these events, all the topics that are discussed in the videos are very important and should be known by the delegates since some past events mentioned here have had a very important effect on Germany's unification.
4. Delegates that have never seen a format of preparation for the conference where they are given documentaries to watch instead of a study guide to read should not fear anything.
